

Nineteen firefighters died while combatting a wildfire near Phoenix on June 30.

The firefighters were members of the Granite Mountain Hotshots, an elite firefighting crew from Prescott, Ariz.

About 200 homes were destroyed in Yarnell and Glen Isla, south of Prescott, Ariz.

The fast-moving fire was sparked by lightning and fed by gusting winds.

Officials lost radio contact with the firefighting crew at 4:30 p.m. They had been working on the fire since about 8 a.m. that day.

The bodies were spotted by helicopter.

All of the firefighters had deployed their emergency fire shelters.

The Arizona wildfires are the deadliest in decades.

It was the deadliest wildfire involving firefighters in 30 years.

It was the highest death toll of firefighters since the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York in 2001.
